## The History of Walled Gardens

In this talk Richard, from Mynd Hardy Plants, traces the development of walled gardens from their origins in Persia to the current day. He examines the factors that determined their size and shape; their location on the estates which they served; and how they were influenced by the Baroque gardens within Europe and the landscape movement at home. The talk concludes with a discussion on the future of walled gardens and what role they will play in the community.

## **News from the Committee Meeting 27th November 2023**

Alan Harvey (co-ordinator of the Photography Group) was welcomed to the meeting as an observer. We were delighted that he agreed to join us and he was formally co-opted onto the committee.

There are now 580 members in Ludlow u3a and the treasurer/membership secretary reported that renewals for 2024 are healthy.

Following reports from committee members, the major topic on the agenda was the composition of the committee for 2024/25. Two members will not stand for re-election at the March AGM, Sue Billing, Barbara Ball and, although Grace Wilkins is willing to stand for re-election to the committee, she wishes to stand-down as

Treasurer/Membership Secretary. Peter Law will have reached the end of his 6-year term of office. This would leave the committee with only six members and vacancies in the vital roles of Speaker Secretary, Study Group Adviser and Treasurer/Membership Secretary.

New committee members from the Ludlow u3a membership will be vital if our u3a is to continue. The meeting was reminded that u3as are run by the members for the members. The committee discussed ways that new members could be encouraged to join. Prospective new committee members are to be invited to the committee meeting in January to meet the committee.

If no prospective new members come forward, the chair will need to investigate the unthinkable -how to dissolve Ludlow u3a. The meeting very much hoped that it would not come to that.

## **Let's Talk Falls**

We have invited a local charity, Community Resource, part of the Community Council of Shropshire, to give us a session on falls prevention at:

St Peter's Parish Centre, Henley Road, Ludlow on Monday 12th February at 10am.

The session will last for 2-2.5 hours. The cost, to cover the hire of the hall and refreshments will be £5. The session entitled 'Let's Talk Falls,' includes a short film and discussion on how to falls-proof your environment as well as a demonstration of how to get up after a fall, details about why staying active is important to prevent falls and a short gentle exercise session.
