Photography




The photography group is starting up again. If you are interested, please contact the members' adviser.




Answer to New Year puzzle (from January's Newsletter)




1/2 of the big square is yellow

Rembrandt and the Third Age




UK Marine Wildlife

Study Groups Subcommittee

The Study Groups Subcommittee met in January to discuss the way forward. The following proposals will be followed up at the full committee meeting on 21st February:

- The committee to carry out an email survey of all members to find out how many members
 cannot join a study group because it is full and also to ask what new study groups they would like
 and if they would be happy to coordinate it.
- The committee to communicate to study group coordinators information about suitable venues for study group meetings.
- The committee to set up meetings for new members together with members of the committee.
- The committee to organise a meeting for study group coordinators prior to the AGM on Monday 28 March.

u3a in Ludlow Committee Members 2022 - 2023

Members of the committee met informally on 24 January to discuss the membership of the committee in the future. Our Chair completes his term of office at the AGM on 28 March. The committee believes it can fill the posts of Chair, Secretary and Treasurer for 2022 - 2023 but it needs to find a Newsletter Editor. There is also a need for someone with confident IT skills to support the work of the committee. Our constitution allows us to have 12 committee members but currently there are only 8 which makes more work for each of us.
