

Andy Griffee



Canals: idyllic inland waterways or sinister crime settings? To Andy Griffee they are both.

Former BBC journalist and producer, Andy Griffee, was inspired to launch into crime writing by the real-life story of Manchester's 'Canal Pusher', the widely reported theory that a spike in deaths by drowning was no accident.

Andy is enthusiastic about narrow boating along some of our 2200 miles of canals which provide him with ample background material for his writing. Andy enjoys using canals as settings for contemporary crime fiction. His talk includes reference to

other authors writing in this genre together with insights into the Midlands setting, plots and characters of his own novel *Canal Pushers*.

Committee Update October 2021

Almost 80 of you attended the AGM on 27 September which was our first face-to-face meeting for nineteen months. Another 60 members sent their apologies, so the meeting was well supported. u3a in Ludlow has never met before in St. Laurence's Church though while the venue was magnificent the acoustics were not as good as some members would have liked.

The Chairman, Robert Hodge, reported that u3a in Ludlow had successfully coped with the pandemic with many groups embracing Zoom for their meetings. Only a handful of groups had not survived the crisis.

The accounts were approved and the Treasurer, Grace Wilkins, pointed out that the sharp increase in the surplus for 2020 was because the subscriptions were paid before the lockdown in March and money was saved since the Monday morning meetings were no longer held face-to-face. The surplus meant that subscriptions for 2021 could be reduced.

The new committee was elected with no change to members and officers apart from the departure of Stuart McLaren. The Chairman thanked Stuart for his valued contribution to u3a in Ludlow over the last six years. In that time he has been study group adviser, vice chairman and chairman.

Study Group Coordinators Consultation

When the committee met on 9th September they spent most of the meeting discussing the results of their meetings with study group coordinators. Most coordinators felt that u3a in Ludlow was a successful organisation and little needed to change. However, they appreciated being consulted and agreed it was appropriate to examine practice and look for possible improvements. Discussion in committee centred round support for coordinators, study groups that are full, Monday morning meetings and promoting u3a in Ludlow. A sub committee has been set up to consider how to take these issues forward.

New Members

The committee agreed that more needs to be done to welcome new members to u3a in Ludlow and another sub committee has been set up to pursue this.
