Who runs Ludlow u3a?

Ludlow u3a is an autonomous charity within the UK-wide network and is run by volunteer members of the u3a. All members in Ludlow are eligible to stand for election to the committee at the AGM and are encouraged to bring their skills to help with the running of the u3a.

The committee of Ludlow u3a meets regularly to ensure its smooth running. The committee organises the programme of monthly meetings, provides support for study group coordinators, and helps with the formation of new study groups.

Committee Members of Ludlow u3a are trustees of a charity and therefore responsible for the proper financial management of the u3a.
